## **Guidelines for Student Dress** **Yeshiva University Undergraduate Programs**

Orthodox Jewish tradition understands dress as an outward manifestation of internal character traits such as respectfulness and modesty. These traits are expected equally of men and women. Men wear long pants, shirts with sleeves, and a kippah. Women wear dresses or skirts below the knee and shirts with modest necklines and sleeves, usually to the elbow.

Adherence to these standards in all academic and religious buildings contributes to a positive campus culture. It demonstrates respect for rebbeim, faculty, and peers, and it signals our sincerity in our shared endeavors as we strive for academic and religious growth.
